

Souper Bowl of **Caring**

Each year our youth take part in the Souper Bowl of Caring, national movement of young people working to fight hunger and poverty in their own communities around the time of the Super Bowl football game. Young people in the congregation take up a collection (many use a soup pot), asking everyone to donate one dollar or one item of food for people in need. Youth give 100% of their donation directly to the local hunger-relief charity of their choice, which for us will be our own Dayton Food Pantry.

Adult Class Continuing Matthew 25 Church


On January 19, the Adult Sunday School class began an eleven-week study of what it means to be a "Matthew 25 church." On that Sunday, we looked at the 25th chapter of Matthew, which relates three parables: the Ten Virgins, the Talents, and the Sheep and Goats (Whenever you did it unto the least of these, you did it unto me). General Assembly has identified three requirements for a Matthew 25 church: fight systemic poverty, promote congregational vitality, and promote structural equality. If you missed the first installment of this on January 19, it is not too late to join us.



On January 26, we will begin our study of the book *Neighborhood Church* by asking "What is our neighborhood?" and how can we focus on it? The class on February 2 will look at "The DNA of Listening." On February 9 and 16, we will consider the chapters titled "Transforming Partnership" and "Integrating Our Space." Both of these chapter encourage ways to optimize the use of our church building. The chapter for February 23, "Sustaining the Vision," looks at worship styles. In March, we will supplement this book with readings from some other sources. We have several copies of Neighborhood Church. Copies of the other readings will be provided. All are welcome to gather in the Board Room for the class, Sundays at 9:15, coffee in hand.

On March 1, the devotional materials for Lent will be available at both entrances



to the sanctuary. This year the Christian Education Committee has provided a choice of two booklets. Please select the one that best meets your needs. Treasure in Jars of Clay: Family **Devotions & Activities for Lent,** by Steve and Sue Givens, offers reflections and activities that reveal that true fulfillment and peace come from God. That power, that forgiving love, is

ours to share. By His Wounds We Are **Healed,** by Paul Scheidt, shows us that it was our sin, our disobedience that Jesus bore in his

body on the cross and "by his wounds we are healed." If you take Presbyterians Today, the current issue contains a book of Lenten devotions titled Becoming a Beloved Community: A Matthew 25 Journey to the Cross. This 37-page, 8 ½ x 11" book helps





us look beyond personal disciplines and commit to creating "beloved communities" in

our own backyards—communities reflecting the inclusive and healing love that Jesus modeled as he made his way to the cross. "Beloved community" is a concept first coined by 20th-Century American philosopher Josiah Royce and picked up by Rev. Dr. Martin Luther King Jr., who popularized it as a society based on justice for all and selfless love of one another.

Thank you for your generous giving to Change for Change in January, which went to the Presbyterian Giving Catalog fund. We collected \$129.00!!!







Your help continues to be needed as we serve our community and the surrounding area in our Food Pantry mission.




