Pastor Nominating Committee Update

We have quietly been busy this past year looking at Pastor Information Forms, having conversations, Zoom meetings and waiting for responses. Through Presbytery, we have received 123 PIF referrals and also a couple self-referrals. Below is a breakdown of what happened with them:

- No response to our inquiry - 51
- Accepted position elsewhere - 15
- In conversation with others - 5
- Looking at us, but no further response - 3
- Declined for various reasons - 21
- Referred to our PNC for review - 28

Of the 28 PIF's we have reviewed as a committee, some weren't a good match for our church from the initial look, some we have had conversations with, others took positions elsewhere, others we felt after conversations weren't a good match for us.

We continue working our way through the process and are thankful for your patience and for Presbytery's help with our questions. We are especially grateful for the guidance of Rev. Jennifer Burns Lewis, our Presbytery liaison.

Please keep us and this process in your prayers as we work through this process as good Presbyterians, "decently and in order."

Your Session met virtually, using the Zoom program, each one of us in our own home, on Tuesday evening, September 15, 2020, and during the meeting the Elders:

- Learned that the construction on the West Door project may be completed in the next two weeks or so. All that remains is the roof and columns.
- Received a "Thank you for being a light in your community!" card from the Presbytery staff.
- Learned that the Indiana Business Entity Report has been filed.
- Approved replenishing our children's books.
- Approved the Youth's painting of a 16-foot diameter Guided Prayer Labyrinth in the south parking lot, between the handicap drive and the basketball goal.
- Approved sending daily devotionals from the PCUSA Website to the Adult Sunday School class.
- Approved participation in a very, very different (due to the pandemic) Jubilee Christmas event, serving 15 families.
- Elected, once again, to continue as we are, without in-house/person-to-person worship, meetings, classes, and other activities (Food Pantry will continue on Thursday mornings, Kids' Closet will continue with a pre-order, carry-out program) until further notice. We will continue to evaluate this from month to month. As situations and circumstances change, we can and will re-evaluate this decision.



HARVEST Trail Mix

This portable snack combines favorite fall flavors.




What you need:

- 1/4 cup maple syrup
- 1 tsp. pumpkin pie spice
- 1/8 tsp. salt
- 2/3 cup pecan pieces
- 1/3 cup roasted pumpkin seeds
- 1/3 cup almonds
- 1/4 cup raisins
- 2/3 cup dried fruit (any)

What you do:

1. Microwave syrup, spices, seeds and nuts for 30 seconds at a time, stirring frequently, until mixture thickens.
2. Spread the mixture on a baking sheet lined with wax paper. Let cool and harden.
3. Break the candied nuts into chunks. Combine with dried fruit.
4. Store in airtight container.




Our usual monthly Kids' Closet continues to be closed due to the COVID19 pandemic, but we are operating in a new way to address the needs of families in our community. Our new system seems to be working; we are generally helping 2 to 4 families each month.

We are currently taking clothing orders from families in need and using curbside pickup to get those orders delivered to our shoppers in the safest manner we can. KC shoppers complete order forms that are available through Facebook, our website (once the site has been updated), and in the Church office during Thursday office hours—9:30 a.m. to 12:30 p.m.

We are also accepting new or gently used donations and are asking that the donations are clean, placed in clean containers, and the containers/bags dated. Donations are accepted during office hours—Thursdays, 9:30 a.m. to 12:30 p.m.

SEED impressions

Create autumn-themed artwork using items from plants.



What you need:

- Seed pods, nuts, pine cones
- Mixing bowl
- 2 cups flour
- 1 cup salt
- 1 cup warm water
- Adult help

What you do:

1. Go on a nature walk and collect seeds with interesting textures.
2. In the bowl, mix flour and salt. Gradually add water. On a table, knead the dough. (If too dry, add more water; if too sticky, add more flour.)
3. Flatten a ball of dough and stamp impressions in it with the seeds.
4. If desired, bake for several hours at 150 degrees until dry and hard. Or, to reuse dough, store in an airtight container up to 6 months.


COMING SOON: A Meditation Labyrinth!!

The Labyrinth is an ancient tool for individual personal prayer and meditation. It is not a maze, and it is not magical. It allows the worshiper to retreat from the world while following a winding path into the center and back out again. The practice is to let go of the stress of life as you enter, ask God for guidance at the center, and pray for illumination as you return.

Planning is underway for our youth to paint a Meditation Labyrinth on the back parking lot. Session has approved this project. When finished, the labyrinth will be available to anyone who feels the need for quiet meditation. Here is a rough sketch illustrating what this might look like.

It will be 16 feet across, which will allow our youth, under the direction of leaders Muriel Grimes and Julie Boles, to paint the lines while maintaining social distancing.





Our Daily Bread is available online at <https://odb.org/>. If you prefer to use an app, one is available for free from GooglePlay or the Apple iTunes App Store.


The **d365 Devotional** app is aimed at youth, but can be enjoyed by adults as well. It is available for free from iTunes and GooglePlay.

Peaceful Neighbor: Discovering the Countercultural Mister Rogers
By Michael G. Long (Westminster John Knox Press, 2015)



Fred Rogers was one of the most radical pacifists of contemporary history. We do not usually think of him as radical, partly because he wore colorful, soft sweaters. Nor do we usually imagine him as a pacifist; that adjective seems way too political to describe the host of a children's program. We have restricted Fred Rogers to the realm of entertainment, children, and feelings, and we've ripped him out of his political and religious context. Rogers was an ordained Presbyterian minister, and although he rarely shared his religious convictions on his program, he fervently believed in a God who accepts us as we are and who desires a world marked by peace and wholeness. He chose as his mission sharing countercultural beliefs about caring nonviolently for one another, animals, and the earth. *Mister Rogers' Neighborhood*, it turns out, is far from sappy, sentimental, and shallow; it is a sharp political response to a violent civil and political society.
