Pastor's Epistle – Rev. Dr. Gladys Nwabah

Have you considered how life may look like when quarantine restrictions are lifted and life returns to “normal”? Did I just say return to “normal”? Will life ever be normal again? Not sure! I strongly believe that what we called our normal life may never be quite the same. It may be a “new” normal life. If that is the case, one then wonders how this new normal life will look. Will it be far detached from the life we were leading before we had the COVID, or will it be just somewhat different? If this new life is far different, how do we plan to transition into it? How do we plan to get back into the “world” we were used to and enjoy it again? These questions are important to think about. 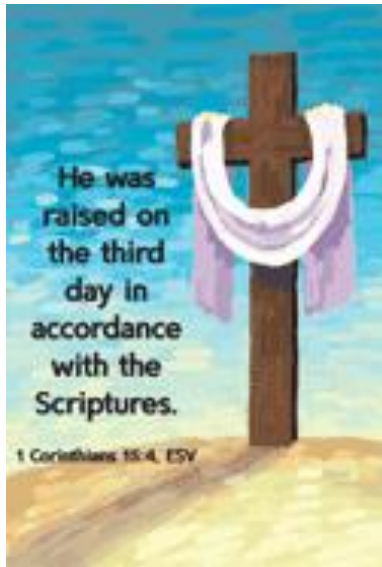

IN CELEBRATION OF CHRIST

Easter Sunday, April 4; Linen Cloth

John 20:1-8: ¹Early on the first day of the week, while it was still dark, Mary Magdalene came to the tomb and saw that the stone had been removed from the tomb. ²So she ran and went to Simon Peter and the other disciple, the one whom Jesus loved, and said to them, "They have taken the Lord out of the tomb, and we do not know where they have laid him." ³Then Peter and the other disciple set out and went toward the tomb. ⁴The two were running together, but the other disciple outran Peter and reached the tomb first. ⁵He bent down to look in and saw the linen wrappings lying there, but he did not go in. ⁶Then Simon Peter came, following him, and went into the tomb. He saw the linen wrappings lying there, ⁷and the cloth that had been on Jesus' head, not lying with the linen wrappings but rolled up in a place by itself. ⁸Then the other disciple, who reached the tomb first, also went in, and he saw and believed;

A simple linen cloth. And yet so profound. For when the disciples entered the tomb of Jesus, they expected to find the body of their slain master. But all they found were the linen wrappings which had wrapped his body. The cloth was there, but Jesus was not. Jesus had thrown off the shrouds of death and returned to life! The empty linen cloth meant that victory over the ancient enemy, death, had finally been won!

***** SESSION NOTES *****

Your Session met virtually, using the Zoom program, each one of us in our own home, on Tuesday evening, March 16, 2021; and during the meeting the Elders:

- Elected to return to in-person worship on May 23, 2021, Pentecost Sunday, with strict safety proposals in place, not unlike those utilized at both our November worship services.
- Learned that no less than 80% of the congregations in our Presbytery have worshipping virtually, online.
- Approved using SundaySchoolTeacher.com as curriculum.
- Approved purchasing and using the book *Children of God, a Storybook Bible* by Desmond Tutu.
- Approved conducting outdoor Vacation Bible School the third week of June, perhaps in the evening, perhaps with an adult (parent) class.
- Received letters of thanks from the Presbyterian Mission support for our contribution, as well as from the Special Offerings Division, the Joy Offering, and the Lafayette Urban Ministry General Fund.
- Received a donation of \$150.00 to the Mission Fund from Dayton Lodge #828, Knights of Pythias, to be matched by the Grand Lodge of Indiana K.of P.
- Learned that our new Wednesday evening Bible Study, using Zoom is going very well and that many more students are welcome.

Pandemic and Our Spiritual and Social Well-being

Our general well-being changed significantly as a result of the pandemic. Yet, life must continue after the pandemic. But it is important to consider especially how COVID quarantine and distancing affected our relationships and interactions with God and with other people and how we can restore these relationships. One way to restore our relationship with God and with people is to overhaul our old ways of handling these relationships and developing a new way of doing things. First, we must get back to the heart of God and of people. Another is that we must go beyond a casual relationship with God to a deeper relationship. Our deeper relationship with God draws people to us and makes it easier for us to enjoy relationships with people.

Churching and Spiritual Healing After the Pandemic

We have been away from the church buildings for a long time because of the COVID. Have you thought about, among other things, how to come back to church? How did you do without physically going to church for worship services and other church activities? How did this impact you? Have you been doing okay spiritually without participation in the church worship and the other church activities? Will you thrive spiritually without going back to church? Why and why not?

David said in **Psalm 122:1-2**, *"I was glad when they said to me, 'Let us go into the house of the Lord.' Our feet have been standing within your gates, O Jerusalem!"* Psalm 122 is one of David's Songs of Ascents. Jewish pilgrims sang this song as they made their way to the Temple in Jerusalem to worship Yahweh. It is a song of joy about the coming together of God's people for worship and fellowship. Memorial P.C. congregation and other people of God meet, among other days, on Sundays in God's house. Permit me, then, to consider Memorial Presbyterian Church at Walnut Street our physical Temple in "Jerusalem." Each week we meet in the house of the Lord not only to meet with our Lord but also to have fellowship with God's other people! Does this excite you?

The Psalmist said, I was glad when they said to me, "Let us go into the house of the Lord." Will this joy and gladness be your experience coming back to church after the COVID quarantine is over? How do you feel whenever you think about coming back into God's house to worship with other people? Are you excited when you wake up and it is Sunday morning? Do you feel excited that it is a day "to go into the house of the Lord?" Is going to church to worship God one of your favorite things to do in the week? Is it at the top of the list you make for the week? Do you feel obligated to attend a worship service or do you look forward to it? Is it delightful or unpleasant to you to attend a worship service? Is it enjoyable or boring to stay through worship services?

David gave reasons why he loved to go to the house of the Lord in Jerusalem, **Psalm 122:3-9**. Is that your experience too? Do you share in David's reasons to go to the house of the Lord? Check your feelings when it's time to go to the house of the Lord. Do you look forward to being in God's presence? And when eventually you come into the sanctuary of the Lord with other people of God, do you feel like you are in God's family? Do you feel delight about worshipping the Lord, fellowshiping with your brothers and sisters from the same family of God?

News Flash! Have you heard that Memorial Presbyterian Church plans to start in-person worship on Sunday, May 23? How do you feel about this news? Do you feel excited that you are coming back into the house of Lord on 731 Walnut Street?

One of David's reasons for being joyful at the news of going to worship at the tabernacle was because of who he would meet there – God and God's people. Do you love God enough that you can't wait to meet him and hang out with Him at the church? Do you love God's people well enough to spend time with them before the Lord?

Food Pantry

The new 3-5 p.m. pick up time on Thursdays was a success in March, with 4 families, representing 17 individuals. The new option operates it in a way similar to the current Kids' Closet process. We are asking individuals to submit their names, phone numbers, addresses, and number of people in their

families to let us know they would like to use our pick up option. We will do our best to fill orders received by Friday to be ready for pick up on Thursday of the following week. However, we will also contact individuals by phone to confirm when their orders will be ready. **NOTE: All restrictions on geographic area served and number of times individuals can come in will continue to apply. Order forms are available through the Church's Facebook pages and website, as well as on the Dayton and Mulberry town Facebook pages.**

We continue to welcome drop in's at our Food Pantry on Thursdays from 9 to 11 am. Donations that have been made of food items and grocery bags continue to be most greatly appreciated! Donations of any of the items in the list at the right would certainly be helpful. Just drop them off at the office any Thursday between 9:30 a.m. and 12:30 p.m. **Bring your receipt to the office, and you'll be reimbursed.**

The DMPC Food Pantry serves the geographical areas of Sheffield Township (which includes the town of Dayton, IN), Lauramie Township (which includes the towns of Clarks Hill and Stockwell, IN), and Clinton County. Families whose children attend Dayton Elementary may also be served by the DMPC Food.

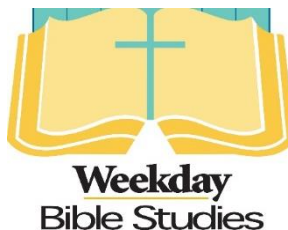

How exciting that we will resume in-person services as of May 23!

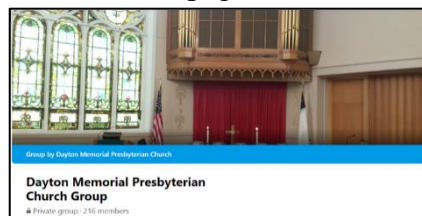
