Pastor's Epistle May 2021 – Rev. Dr. Gladys Nwabah

Memorial Presbyterian Church Pastor's Wednesday Bible Study kicked off on Zoom March 3, 2021. We are on Theme 1, Lessons from the man after God's own heart. This theme is taken from **I Samuel 13:14; Acts 12:22**. We have done eight lessons already from the Theme. A lot of take-home lessons emerged from our studies and discussions. From each lesson, we also learn a short bible verse by heart (memory verse).

In the next few editions of the newsletter, I will discuss some of the take-home lessons from our study. The first lesson from the study is the importance of taking care of the heart and how our hearts inform our actions and speech. We also learned that only God knows the heart. God looks at the heart. In **I Samuel 16:1-13**, for example, God surprised Prophet Samuel, Jesse, and his sons, including David, by asking Samuel to anoint the boy David as the would-be king of Israel and rejecting the more qualified sons of Jesse. God told Samuel: *The LORD doesn't see things the way you see them. People judge by outward appearance, but the LORD looks at the heart* **I Samuel 16:7b**. God sees the mind and the heart **Jeremiah 20:12**. He examines us and tests our minds and hearts **Psalms 26:2**. He knows the secrets of the heart **Psalms 44:21**.

David admits that God knows everything about us including what goes on in our hearts when he said,

"O LORD, you have examined my heart and know everything about me. You know when I sit down or stand up. You know my thoughts even when I'm far away. You see me when I travel and when I rest at home. You know everything I do. You know what I am going to say even before I say it, LORD. You go before me and follow me. You place your hand of blessing on my head.

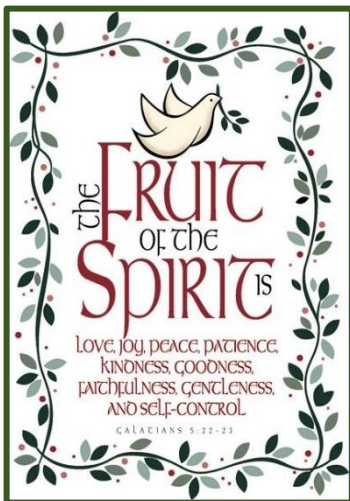


*** SESSION NOTES ***

CHILDREN AT RISK • YOUTH • YOUNG ADULTS

Over this past year, we have seen how important it is to watch and learn from young people.

Throughout our church, and around the world, children, youth and young adults have been part of teaching technology to older adults. They have been important in teaching about injustice and leading movements for change in their own communities.

We know how important it is to give young people a good foundation in faith, in education and in life. The Pentecost Offering helps us support the development of our young people through ministries of education, spiritual formation events like the 4,000+ gathering called the Presbyterian Youth Triennium, and through service as Young Adult Volunteers. It also encourages us to see how children, youth and young adults teach us new things and help us shape our faith, too.

As we make our gifts to the Pentecost Offering, remember that 40% stays with our congregation to support local ministries with children, youth and young adults. The gifts we share will help young people learn important lessons about life and faith, and because they teach us, we will get to learn some lessons, too. Please give generously, for when we all do a little, it adds up to a lot.

*Such knowledge is too wonderful for me, too great for me to understand! I can never escape from your Spirit! I can never get away from your presence! If I go up to heaven, you are there; if I go down to the grave¹ you are there. If I ride the wings of the morning, if I dwell by the farthest oceans, even there your hand will guide me, and your strength will support me. I could ask the darkness to hide me and the light around me to become night—but even in darkness I cannot hide from you. To you the night shines as bright as day. Darkness and light are the same to you. You made all the delicate, inner parts of my body and knit me together in my mother's womb. Thank you for making me so wonderfully complex! Your workmanship is marvelous—how well I know it. You watched me as I was being formed in utter seclusion, as I was woven together in the dark of the womb. You saw me before I was born. Every day of my life was recorded in your book. Every moment was laid out before a single day had passed. **Psalm 139:1-16.***

Since God knows the heart and weighs motives, convictions, and intentions, how does this affect us? First, we must come to the realization that the heart must be checked constantly because *"The human heart is the most deceitful of all things, and desperately wicked. Who really knows how bad it is?"* **Jeremiah 17:9.** It is only God who knows how sick the human heart is. He is also the only one who knows how to mend it. King Saul exhibited a sick heart in all his dealings with David. David, on the other hand, displayed a healed heart in his own dealings with Saul. For further studies, see **I Samuel 18:8-11; 19:9-12; 22:17-18; 24:1-22; 26:1-25.**

Secondly, we must come to God to cleanse our hearts. If not, we experience what St. Paul described in **Romans 7:15-25,**

"I don't really understand myself, for I want to do what is right, but I don't do it. Instead, I do what I hate. But if I know that what I am doing is wrong, this shows that I agree that the law is good. So I am not the one doing wrong; it is sin living in me that does it. And I know that nothing good lives in me, that is, in my sinful nature. I want to do what is right, but I can't. I want to do what is good, but I don't. I don't want to do what is wrong, but I do it anyway. But if I do what I don't want to do, I am not really the one doing wrong; it is sin living in me that does it. I have discovered this principle of life—that when I want to do what is right, I inevitably do what is wrong. I love God's law with all my heart. But there is another power within me that is at war with my mind. This power makes me a slave to the sin that is still within me. Oh, what a miserable person I am! Who will free me from this life that is dominated by sin and death? Thank God! The answer is in Jesus Christ our Lord. So you see how it is: In my mind I really want to obey God's law, but because of my sinful nature I am a slave to sin."

Jesus is the healing to a sick heart. With our sick heart, we come to God by faith. We ask Him to cleanse us and to make His abode in our heart. He gives us the gift of a new heart. It's free! *"God saved you by his grace when you believed. And you can't take credit for this; it is a gift from God. Salvation is not a reward for the good things we have done, so none of us can boast about it"* **Ephesians 2:8-9.** We constantly keep our hearts checked through the word of God, through prayer, through fellowship, and through counseling.

Our mission is to supplement food resources of individuals and families.



Our church has been involved in this very worthwhile mission endeavor for many years. Six of our church members (plus 2 alternates) have served in the pantry yearly for 2 days in April, July, and November.

Several of us are feeling the need to retire from this worthy mission. Since COVID, the Pantry has been open only one day a week (Wednesday) and will probably continue the 1 day a week schedule for the unforeseeable future.

We are looking for 4 people to volunteer to fill our places from 11:30 AM until 3:00 PM on a designated Wednesday in July and in November of this year and in April, July, and November in future years so that our church is not forced to withdraw from this very important mission for the hungry of Lafayette and allow us to remain part of this program.

I will be happy to work along with you this year so that you will feel at ease "learning the simple ropes."

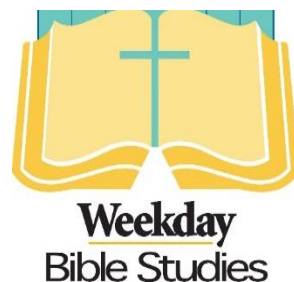

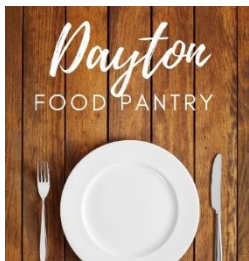


KIDS' CLOSET— NEW SYSTEM RUNNING SMOOTHLY!!!

Food Pantry

At the beginning of April, our late-afternoon Food Pantry pick up assisted another family, representing 6 individuals. The new option operates it in a way similar to the current Kids' Closet process. We are asking individuals to submit their names, phone numbers, addresses, and number of people in their families to let us know they would like to use our pick up option. We will do our best to fill orders received by Friday to be ready for pick up on Thursday of the following week. However, we will also contact individuals by phone to confirm when their orders will be ready. **NOTE: All restrictions on geographic area served and number of times individuals can come in will continue to apply. Order forms are available through the Church's Facebook pages and website, as well as on the Dayton and Mulberry town Facebook pages.**

We continue to welcome drop in's at our Food Pantry on Thursdays from 9 to 11 am. Donations that have been made of food items and grocery bags continue to be most greatly appreciated! Just drop off donations at the office any Thursday between 9:30 a.m. and 12:30 p.m. ***Bring your receipt to the office, and you'll be reimbursed.***

If you have ideas of how we can better reach families in need about our Thursday morning and afternoon programs at the Dayton Food Pantry, please contact the office (see pages 1 & 4 for contact information).

The DMPC Food Pantry serves the geographical areas of Sheffield Township (which includes the town of Dayton, IN), Lauramie Township (which includes the towns of Clarks Hill and Stockwell, IN), and Clinton County. Families whose children attend Dayton Elementary may also be served by the DMPC Food. Each family/individual may come to the Food Pantry once every 30 days.





How exciting that we will resume in-person services as of May 23!

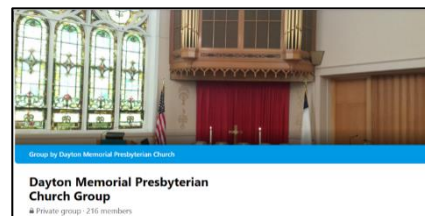
