Pastor's Epistle – Rev. Dr. Gladys Nwabah

What a journey!

Church family, my son and I have finally arrived to call Indiana home. To tell you the journey was easy would not be true, but the Lord showed up and brought us here safely! (Psalm 121:8)

As we prepared to come to Indiana, we faced a few challenges along the way. The first challenge was the relocation service itself. The company that would relocate us, we soon realized as we dealt with them, were not honorable and did not have the best of intentions. They sought to take advantage of us and continued till the delivery to seek any way to get more money than what they agreed to. Despite their best attempt, everything came together well.

During the day of our flight, after we boarded, we were informed there was an issue with the engine. After waiting over one hour for it to be corrected, we were deplaned and told to try and make a different flight, with no guarantees. After three hours from the time our original flight was to leave, we just barely squeaked through to another flight. Fortunately, our luggage also made it and the journey went smoothly.

We finally arrived in Indiana and got a good welcome by a lot of snow on the ground and a continued “rain” of the snow for the next few days, a beautiful sight to see! My son saw snow for the first time; and of course, spent some time playing outside.

IN CELEBRATION OF LENT

Third Sunday of Lent, March 7; Bowl and Towel



John 13:3-5: ³Jesus, knowing that the Father had given all things into his hands, and that he had come from God and was going to God, ⁴got up from the table, took off his outer robe, and tied a towel around himself. ⁵then he poured water into a basin and began to wash the disciples' feet and to wipe them with the towel that was tied around him. ⁶He came to Simon Peter, who said to him, "Lord, are you going to wash my feet?" ⁷Jesus answered, "You do not know now what I am doing, but later you will understand." ⁸Peter said to him, "You will never wash my feet." Jesus answered, "Unless I wash you, you have no share with me."

Matthew 27:20-24: ²⁰Now the chief priests and the elders persuaded the crowds to ask for Barabbas and to have Jesus kissed. ²¹The governor again said to them, "Which of the two do you want me to release for you?" And they said, "Barabbas." ²²Pilate said to them, "Then what should I do with Jesus who is called the Messiah?" All of them said, "Let him be crucified!" ²³Then he asked, "Why, what evil has he done?" But they shouted all the more, "Let him be crucified!" ²⁴So when Pilate saw that he could do nothing, but rather that a riot was beginning, he took some water and washed his hands before the crowd, saying, "I am innocent of this man's blood; see to it yourselves."

We all want to be clean. As we wash our bodies of dirt, so human beings want to cleanse their souls of guilt. Pilate thought he could do that himself. He thought that by washing his own hands he could avoid guilt for Jesus' death. But our own efforts can never cleanse our souls. Jesus showed us that when he took a basin and a towel and washed his disciples' feet. He said, "Unless I wash you, you have no share with me." The towel and the bowl represent the cleansing power of Jesus.

Fourth Sunday of Lent, March 14; Coins



Matthew 26:14-16: ¹⁴Then one of the twelve, who was called Judas Iscariot, went to the chief priests ¹⁵and said, "What will you give me if I betray him to you?" They paid him thirty pieces of silver. ¹⁶And from that moment he began to look for an opportunity to betray him.

Matthew 27:1-8: ¹When morning came, all the chief priests and the elders of the people conferred together against Jesus in order to bring about his death. ²They bound him, led him away, and handed him over to Pilate the governor.

³When Judas, his betrayer, saw that Jesus was condemned, he repented and brought back the thirty pieces of silver to the chief priests and the elders. ⁴He said, "I have sinned by betraying innocent blood." But they said, "What is that to us? See to it yourself." ⁵Throwing down the pieces of silver in the temple, he departed; and he went and hanged himself. ⁶But the chief priests, taking the pieces of silver, said, "It is not lawful to put them into the treasury, since they are blood money." ⁷After conferring together, they used them to buy the potter's field as a place to bury foreigners. ⁸For this reason that field has been called the Field of Blood to this day.

This morning we place coins at the foot of the cross. Judas received thirty pieces of silver, the ancient price of a slave, for turning Jesus over to the authorities. He let greed come between himself and Jesus. Jesus himself said, "You cannot serve God and wealth." Our money is to be used to further the kingdom of God, not to make us rich at the expense of others, especially Jesus. The coins are a symbol of the evil that money can do, or the good.

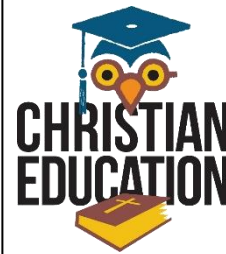
KIDS' CLOSET— NEW "SYSTEM" CATCHING ON!!!

IN CELEBRATION OF LENT (CONT.)

Fifth Sunday of Lent, March 21; Crown of Thorns



Matthew 27:27-31: ²⁷ Then the soldiers of the governor took Jesus into the governor's headquarters,^[a] and they gathered the whole cohort around him. ²⁸ They stripped him and put a scarlet robe on him, ²⁹ and after twisting some thorns into a crown, they put it on his head. They put a reed in his right hand and knelt before him and mocked him, saying, "Hail, King of the Jews!" ³⁰ They spat on him, and took the reed and struck him on the head. ³¹ After mocking him, they stripped him of the robe and put his own clothes on him. Then they led him away to crucify him.

A crown of thorns is a great contradiction! A crown symbolizes kingship and power and glory. Crowns are supposed to be made of gold. But this crown was made of thorns. It was an instrument of mockery and of torture. And yet, unwittingly, the soldiers who placed the crown of thorns on Jesus' head were revealing a great truth: Jesus' kingdom is not like those of this world. Jesus is exalted precisely because he is humbled. He is crowned the king because of his obedience, even to death. The crown of thorns symbolizes the humiliation and the exaltation of Christ.

Palm Sunday of Lent, March 28; Nails



John 20:25-28: ²⁵ So the other disciples told him, "We have seen the Lord." But he said to them, "Unless I see the mark of the nails in his hands, and put my finger in the mark of the nails and my hand in his side, I will not believe."

²⁶ A week later his disciples were again in the house, and Thomas was with them. Although the doors were shut, Jesus came and stood among them and said, "Peace be with you." ²⁷ Then he said to Thomas, "Put your finger here and see my hands. Reach out your hand and put it in my side. Do not doubt but believe." ²⁸ Thomas answered him, "My Lord and my God!"

Colossians 2:13-14: ¹³ And when you were dead in trespasses and the uncircumcision of your flesh, God^[a] made you^[b] alive together with him, when he forgave us all our trespasses, ¹⁴ erasing the record that stood against us with its legal demands. He set this aside, nailing it to the cross.

Jesus was crucified by having nails driven through his hands or wrists and his feet. These wounds fulfilled what the prophet Isaiah had said, "... he was wounded for our transgressions, crushed for our iniquities; upon him was the punishment that made us whole, and by his bruises we are healed." The Apostle Paul says that our guilt was nailed to the cross with Jesus and because of that, we are now set free. The nails are a symbol of the price Jesus paid for your forgiveness.

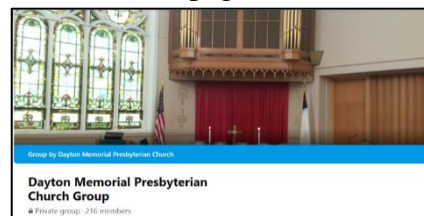

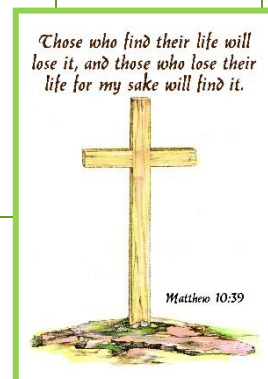

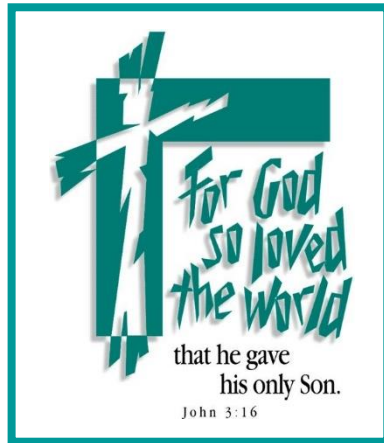
