### Sermon Series Beginning February 2022

January's sermon focus will be on the *Armor of God*. Then in February, I will present sermons focusing on our spiritual well-being. In preparation for this series, church members are encouraged to take the GPS Spiritual Inventory.

The GPS Spiritual Inventory measures the health of our souls. Our souls are informed by our relationships with God, with ourselves, and with other people; and the GPS measures the depth of those relationships. The GPS helps us locate where we are right now so that we can begin a journey led by the love of God.

The three factors of spiritual health are our level of attachment to God, our level of self-differentiation, and our level of empathy for others. Each factor has three essentials to guide us along the way.

In terms of *our attachment to God*, the three essentials are trust in God, communication with God, and a sense of closeness to God.


Our *level of self-differentiation* includes forgiveness, emotional regulation, and vulnerability.

The essentials of our level of empathy for others includes

listening to others, feeling what others feel, and actively loving others.

This Spiritual Health Checkup includes a personal feedback report and a teaching/coaching/studying session which will help address one's spiritual needs and will assist in developing a spiritual health maintenance plan. As a certified GPS coach myself, I will provide coaching services for free through the Sunday sermon series, adult Sunday School, the Spring Pastor's Bible Study, and through individual counseling for anyone who requests it.



# GUIDED PRAYER LABYRINTH

Last October, our youth group put together a labyrinth on our church parking lot for all to enjoy! This is open to our church members and the public, to be used as a way to pray



or meditate . . . to make a closer connection with God and to find peace and purpose.

While there is no one right way of praying that is fruitful for everybody all the time, stepping into the labyrinth can physically be an intentional way of stepping out of the chaos in our lives and focusing on turning that chaos over to God, receiving the Holy Spirit, and listening to God.

An optional guide is offered below:

- 1) Walking in . . . pray for a release of your fears and distractions, "Let Go and Let God."
- 2) At CENTER . . . pray for illumination, pray for the Holy Spirit to fill you with life anew.
- 3) Walking out ... pray for intention. Let the Holy Spirit guide you in living out God's will. Love one another.

We pray this reflection brings calmness to your hearts and minds and renewed energy to go into the world as the gifts God intends you to be. We encourage you to visit it as often as you'd like!

### KIDS' CLOSET—

### New "System" Catching on !!!

Our usual monthly Kids' Closet continues to be closed due to the COVID19 pandemic, but we are operating in a new way to address the needs of families in our community.

Our new system seems to be working; we are generally helping 2 to 4 families each month.

We are currently taking clothing orders from families in need and using curbside pickup to get those orders delivered to our shoppers in the safest manner we can. KC shoppers complete order forms that are available through Facebook, our website (once the site has been updated), and in the Church office during Thursday office hours—9:30 a.m. to 12:30 p.m.

We are also accepting new or gently used donations and are asking that the donations are clean, placed in clean containers, and the containers/bags dated. Donations are accepted during office hours—Tuesdays, Wednesdays, & Thursdays, 9:30 a.m. to 12:30 p.m.

Please encourage anyone in need in our area to visit our Food Pantry, using either the traditional walk-in option from 9 to 11 a.m. on Thursday mornings OR the pre-order & pick up option on Thursday afternoons, 3 to 5 p.m. The new option operates in a way similar to the current Kids' Closet process. We are asking individuals to submit their names, phone numbers, addresses, and number of people in their families to let us know

they would like to use our pick-up option. We will do our best to fill orders received by Friday to be ready for pick up on Thursday of the following week. However, we will also contact individuals by phone to confirm when their orders will be ready. *NOTE: All restrictions on geographic area served and number of times individuals can come in will continue to apply.* Order forms are available through the Church's Facebook pages and website, as well as on the Dayton and Mulberry town Facebook pages.

Donations that have been made of food items and grocery bags continue to be most greatly appreciated! Just drop off donations at the office any Thursday between 9:30 a.m. and 12:30 p.m. *Bring your receipt to the office, and you'll be reimbursed.*

### Introducing the GPS: God – Personal - Social



The GPS Spiritual Inventory navigates, measures, and targets spiritual vital signs. This is the first of its kind. It measures the health of the soul and enables one to know where they are spiritually. It identifies the areas in which one does well and the areas that need improvement. The result of the assessment will amaze anyone. The website to take the assessment is soul-metrics.com. The GPS Inventory costs \$29.95, which goes to the founder and developers of the program. You will be glad you spent this money. (If the cost is prohibitive, Pastor Gladys will cover the fee. Contact her by phone or her email.) The assessment takes about 10 minutes to complete and the results of the survey will be sent to you by the sponsors of the program. The Spiritual Health Checkup includes a personal feedback report and a teaching/coaching/studying session which will help address one's spiritual needs and assist in developing a spiritual health maintenance plan. When you fill out your information, you will be asked to supply the email of your coach. You may put my email, gabisglad@gmail.com. I am a certified GPS Spiritual Inventory Practitioner. GPS coaches and practitioners provide services through the teaching of the 9 essentials of spiritual growth and each coaching session costs \$150-\$250; counseling sessions costs \$250-\$350. However, I will provide the services for free through the Pastors Bible Study, Sunday School, and Sunday Sermons and individual counseling.

By improving one's spiritual life, one can contribute to the healing process of the soul. As spiritual health grows for an individual, his/her overall health and wellness grows; and with increased health and wellness comes a greater ability to move forward in one's personal development and goal achievement. This tool, when combined with coaching, has helped church members bounce back to life in their relationship with family members, church members, friends and neighbors. It can give renewed vigor to leadership, and it can even be designed as an adult Sunday School program to keep people engaged.
