Crowded Days and Nights: A Call to Step Back!

Pastor's Epistle

Our daily lives are plagued by stress. Our days and nights are filled with endless activities. We have demands from family, church, community, etc. We try to be everything to everyone. Unfortunately, we are overwhelmed, stressed, and tired; and to make life better for us, we try our best to prioritize needs and demands; yet we still are not able to cope with things. We try other coping techniques like dieting and exercise, and we still notice that our crowded lives do not go away.

Interestingly, life does not present a dull moment. Things happen and new things keep coming up, leading to an unending cycle of events. We pay bills, meet work demands, attend to our health and the health of families, meet assignment deadlines, help family, friends, and neighbors, attend to the needs of distant people, engage in community and church activities and programs, organize marriages, ceremonies, and funerals and the list continues. There is never an empty basket of activities and programs because we have new activities popping up on us, new information and deadlines pushing us to our limits.

All of this attests to the fact that our stress level keeps rising and relationships are negatively affected. Who can deliver us from this overwhelming “busyness?”

As I thought and prayed about how to cope with my crowded life, I found God speaking to me through the February 10 Jesus Calling Devotional. The

KIDS' CLOSET— NEW “SYSTEM” CATCHING ON!!!

Our usual monthly Kids' Closet continues to be closed due to the COVID19 pandemic, but we are operating in a new way to address the needs of families in our community.

Our new system seems to be working; we are generally helping 2 to 4 families each month.

We are currently taking clothing orders from families in need and using curbside pickup to get those orders delivered to our shoppers in the safest manner we can. KC shoppers complete order forms that are available through Facebook, our website (once the site has been updated), and in the Church office during Thursday office hours—9:30 a.m. to 12:30 p.m.

We are also accepting new or gently used donations and are asking that the donations are clean, placed in clean containers, and the containers/bags dated. Donations are accepted during office hours—Tuesdays, Wednesdays, & Thursdays, 9:30 a.m. to 12:30 p.m.

Lord says to me, *"Trust me enough to spend ample time with Me, pushing back the demands of the day. Refuse to feel guilty about something that is so pleasing to Me, the King of the universe. Because I am omnipotent, I am able to bend time and events in your favor. You will find that you can accomplish more in less time, after you have given yourself to Me in rich communion. Also, as you align yourself with my perspective, you can sort out what is important and what is not. Don't fall into the trap of being on the go. Many, many things you do in My name have no value in My kingdom. To avoid meaningless works, stay in continual communication with Me. I will instruct you and teach you in the way you should go, I will counsel you with My eye upon you."*

In Luke 10:41-42, Jesus said to Martha, *"Martha, Martha ... you are worried and upset about many things, but only one thing is needed, Mary has chosen what is better, and it will not be taken away from her."* Martha worried about details like I do, unfortunately. Martha wanted to please Jesus and to get approval from Jesus for her serving “busyness.” So, she worked and worked and worked and did not relax to even pay attention to her guest! She wouldn't sit down for a minute or relax to know why her guest visited. Martha thought that resting at the feet of Jesus spells laziness. Martha even thought that Mary was not serving Jesus when she didn't leave her place of rest at Jesus's feet to help her in preparing meals for Jesus. But Mary was actually serving Jesus; just sitting, listening, and having a good time with Jesus. And Jesus applauded Mary's style of serving!

We are sometimes like Martha, busy serving the Lord Jesus but not spending time with Jesus, our Master. This makes our service “self-serving.” We must not let our service to God become mere busywork. This happens when we serve God without having a solid devotion to him.

In this brand-new year 2022, I pray that the Lord who cares so much about our physical and spiritual wellbeing will continue to give us grace to not only serve him but to also spend time in God's presence. Like Mary did, we will get a smile and a commendation from Jesus.



Where would we find Jesus? Here, in our congregation? Look around. Or in our neighborhoods?


What if this is the time? What if this is the place?




In *Goliath Must Fall*, Louie Giglio writes, "Our giants keep taunting us, so we need to hold God at his word: that he is already victorious." Instead of "staring at our giant," we must "lock eyes with Jesus" and remember that "life is short and God is big." With bold hearts, adds Giglio, we can worship with "holy urgency" while giants fall.





What you need:

- Elastic string (12 inches)
- Colored beads (see below)
- Clear nail polish

What you do:

1. Knot the string at one end.
Add beads in this order:
blue, white, gold, green,
yellow, red, black, orange
2. Tie the ends so the bracelet
fits your wrist. Place a dot
of nail polish to secure the
knot. Trim excess string.
3. As you pray, use the bead
colors as reminders of Jesus'
words (see Matthew 6:9-13):

- **blue** = the Father
- **white** = God's holiness
- **gold** = God's kingdom
- **green** = the earth
- **yellow** = wheat (bread)
- **red** = Christ's blood
(forgiveness)
- **black** = temptation
- **orange** = God's power
to deliver


