<u>Pastor's Epistle November 2022 – Rev. Dr. Gladys Nwabah</u> <u>We Need Your Friendship</u>

Memorial Presbyterian Church needs your friendship. Give us a chance to befriend you. It could start today or any time. Whenever it starts, we will enjoy you; and you will enjoy us. Unplanned friendship started between David and Jonathan. It was one of the best accounts of friendship recorded in the Bible. How did it start? Let's see how it started.

The battle between the Philistines and the Israelites ended abruptly! Confusion settled on faces; screaming and escapes were seen. Then a deep silence descended on the battle arena. Something just happened! A giant had just been killed, Giant Goliath. Israel had been delivered from an imminent danger. Who won this victory? David! Who was David? A shepherd boy who, without a battle outfit and weapons, volunteered to challenge the Philistine giant who terrorized Israel for several days. How did David win the battle? Read what David said before he engaged the giant. "You come to me with a sword, with a spear, and with a javelin. But I come to you in the name of the LORD of hosts, the God of the armies of Israel, whom you have defied. This day the LORD will deliver you into my hand, and I will strike you and take your head from you . . . that all the earth may know that there is a God in Israel. Then all this assembly shall know that the LORD does not save with sword and spear; for the battle is the LORD's, and He will give you into our hands. (**1 Samuel 17:45–47**).

- Learned that the Trustees' cleaning out of the church attic has been postponed. Items must be saved by attaching yellow tape (which is there) with an appropriate message.
- Reported, with sadness, that Robert W. Yost (Chron. #276) passed away on October 4, 2022, at Mulberry Health and Rehabilitation. A memorial service was held at Memorial Presbyterian Church on October 13. Interment was at the Wyandotte Cemetery.
- Reported also, that Charles R. (Bob) Millikan (Chron. #316) passed away on October 16, 2022, at Mulberry Health and Rehabilitation. No service is planned at this time.



to God the Father through him. Colossians 3:17 David picked up a stone, put it in a sling and hurled it at Goliath's forehead. Immediately the giant was killed, and victory went to Israel. Saul held a briefing; his son Jonathan was standing by him. The palace guards were present, too.

David was excited to recount how it all happened. Saul listened intently as the shepherd boy shared how his heart jumped as he reached down to his shepherd bag to select the stone he used. David narrated the interesting story of having a giant on the ground and chopping off his head with the giant's sword. While he was doing that, little did he know that he was leaving an indelible impression on the son of the king, Jonathan. While the palace guards cheered; Jonathan, Saul's son, smiled broadly in admiration of this brave boy. Jonathan was no stranger to war victories. But this day, he witnessed a special person winning a special war. "When David had finished speaking to Saul, the soul of Jonathan was bound to the soul of David, and Jonathan loved him as his own soul, I Samuel 18:1-4.

We can call David and Jonathan's love "Love at first sight." Their friendship is one of the greatest we see in the Bible. Why did David and Jonathan click? They see in each other a common passion. Friendships are usually formed when two people find they have similar beliefs, values, attitudes, and disposition to life. It may start with a first impression, or it may develop with time. In October, we were able to help 7 families (all NEW families to KC) and 18 children.


We will be open to the public once more in 2022 on Saturday. November 12, from 9 to 11 am.


We are also looking for a volunteer to deliver our "overflow" clothing to Stockwell's clothing mission once a month. Please reach out if you are able!
